MAKE A DIFFERENCE SCHOLARSHIP

The Elizabeth “Biz” Rohlwing Make a Difference Scholarship was established in 2013 to recognize and support DCHS graduates in their pursuit of education after high school.

Biz Rohlwing was a 2008 graduate of Dundee-Crown High School who passed away in May of 2012. Biz had a love for life and sense of adventure that would take her around the world on travels, making sure she made friends everywhere she went. While at Dundee-Crown, she had a passion for soccer where she loved being a part of the team and would take the time to help her teammates in any way possible. Biz also enjoyed journalism and loved to amplify community voices by documenting people’s stories and lived experiences through words and photography.

In the spirit of Biz’s love for life and to support young people on their journey to make a difference, the Make A Difference Scholarship fund has been established in the annual amount of \$2,000. Students who plan to use their advanced education to make a difference, empower others, or drive change are highly encouraged to apply for this one-time scholarship grant.

Eligibility and Requirements

The Elizabeth “Biz” Rohlwing Scholarship is open to any 2025 DCHS graduating senior who is planning to attend community college, a vocational program, trade school, or four-year university in the fall. The number of recipients and scholarship amount may vary for each recipient.

Any student interested in this scholarship should complete the following documentation and return to the Counseling Office, apply online, or submit via email (committee@makeadifferencescholarship.com) by Friday, April 11th, 2025.

- Completed Application
- 1 Letter of Recommendation (may be from DCHS Staff or community leader)
- 500-word essay answering one of the following prompts:
 - 1. How has your life experience contributed to your degree or career choice? How will you use your career to help make a difference?
 - 2. Who is your hero and what made their presence in your life so impactful? How will you use your career to become a hero to others?
